6. RIDERS AND MOTORCYCLES

All competitors (Speedway 500cc) must hold valid Speedway / Track Racing license issued by the Estonian Motorcycling Federation (EMF), Latvijas Motorsport Federación (LaMSF), Moottoriliitto Finland ry (SML) or FIM/FIM EUROPE.

Foreign riders must submit starting permission of their FMN.

Technical rules for Speedway 80 (junior speedway)

Motorcycles must be equipped with a functional ignition kill switch, that is capable of stopping a running engine. The ignition cut-out must be fitted on the handlebar, as close as is practicable to the throttle. The ignition cut-out must stop the engine immediately, by the simple action of pulling a lanyard or a non-elastic string (which must be as short as possible) attached to the rider's right wrist.

Motorcycles must be fitted with mudguards. Recommended distance from the rear wheel tyre surface and the rear end of the rear mudguard max 35mm.

If a push bar is used, it should be made in one piece, of strong material which should

not break under impact and must not protrude any higher than 35mm above the rear mudguard.

Rear wheel size: max 17"

Motorcycles must be equipped with a single cylinder, 2-stroke (max 85cc) or 4-stroke (max 125cc) engine,

Technical rules for Speedway 500 according FIM Technical Rules for Track Racing (Including Rules for Motoball) 2014.

9. RACE FORMAT

Speedway 500cc - There will be Classification heats, Semi-Finals and Grand Final. Based on classification, the 8 top-scoring riders will qualify for the Semi-final heats as follows:

Riders placed 1st, 4th, 6th, 7th will take part in Semi-final heat 1.

Riders placed 2nd, 3rd, 5th, 8th will take part in Semi-final heat 2.

The gate positions for each Semi-final heat will be chosen by the riders, in the order based on the classification. The riders placed first and second in each Semi-final heat will qualify for the Grand Final heat. Riders gate position for the Grand Final heat will be chosen by the riders in the order based by the total points scored after Semi-finals. Riders scores :3 points for 1st place; 2 points for 2nd place; 1 point for 3rd and 0 points for 4th place.

Speedway 80cc - There will be Classification heats, Semi-Finals and Grand Final. Based on classification, the 4 top-scoring riders from both country will qualify for the Semi-final heats as follows:

Estonian Riders will take part in Semi-final heat 1.

Finnish Riders will take part in Semi-final heat 2.

The gate positions for each Semi-final heat will be chosen by the riders, in the order based on the classification. The riders placed first and second in each Semi-final heat will qualify for the Grand Final heat. Riders gate position for the Grand Final heat will be chosen by the riders in the order based by the total points scored after Semi-finals. Riders scores :3 points for 1st place; 2 points for 2nd place; 1 point for 3rd and 0 points for 4th place.

All heats are run in an anti-clockwise direction.

Heats will consist of 4 laps

10. PROTESTS

All protests must be made according to *FIM Track Racing Appendices 070* Any protest must be lodged immediately after the reason for the protest is known. They must be in writing and submitted to the Clerk of the Course with the security deposit 100€. No protest or appeal can be made against a decision made by the Referee. Protests against results must be presented within 15 minutes following the publication of the results.
